According to the World Economic Forum 's ranking in 2019, Thailand has the competitiveness of tourism is ranked 31 (out of 140 countries), ranked third in ASEAN, after Singapore and Malaysia, with 2 sub-dimensions that Thailand ranks very low, namely Environmental Sustainability , ranked 130th and Safety and security (Safety and security) ranked 111 (Bangkok Business , 2020) from the above.

The World Tourism Organization has identified the safety of tourists. which must be considered from the risks that can occur from 4 sources together, which overall correspond with tourism safety indicators but are grouped according to the sources that cause insecurity for tourists, consisting of from human action and the environment outside the industry. Tourism includes the most common offenses victimized by tourists (theft, pickpocketing). assault, assault, fraud) act Random and specific harm (rape), organized crime pre-planned and deliberate preparation (slavery, extortion, coercion) extortion), terrorism and unlawful invasion of government premises. war taking hostages and hijacking, war, social conflicts, and political and religious insurgency, as well as systemic flaws. Public defense, organization and related services from the tourism sector and the sector involved, including defects in terms of safety standards (such as causing a fire error from construction and lack of earthquake prevention measures, etc.). 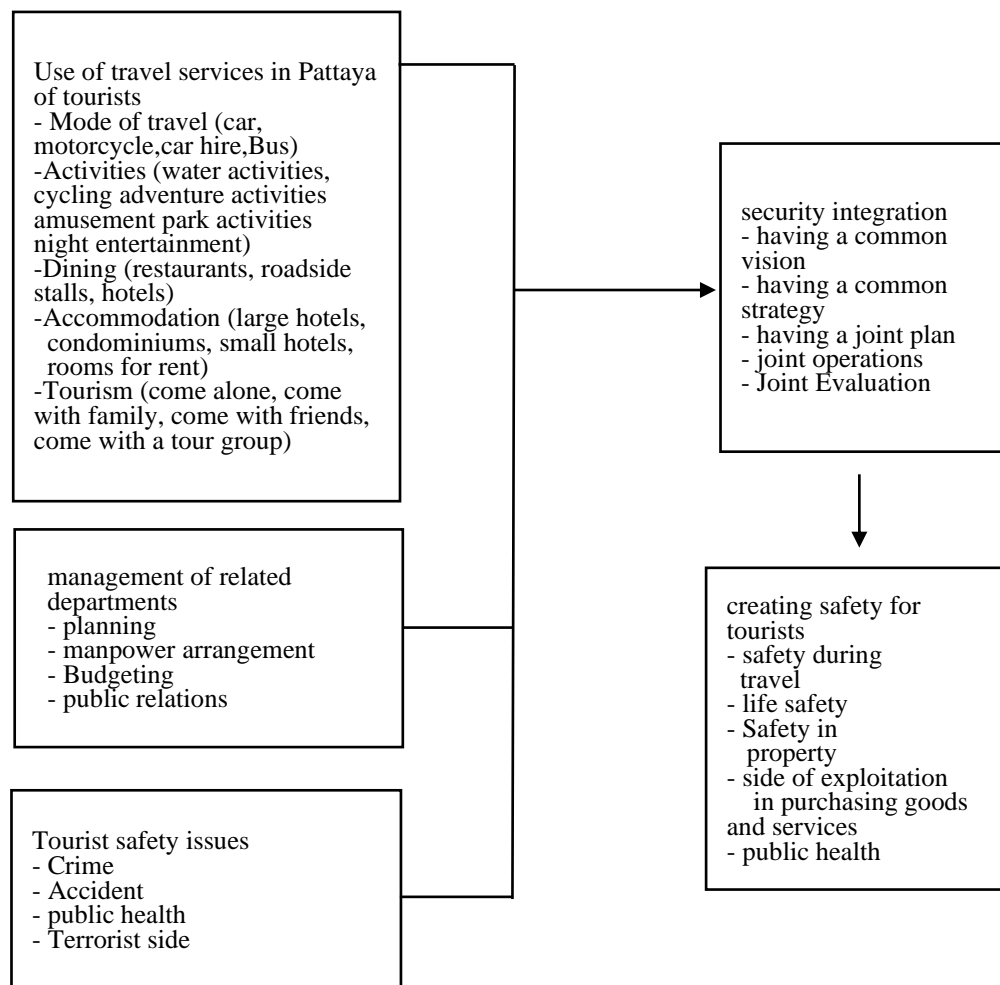
